GOD OVER THE NATIONS

Jeremiah was a hero. God called him to be a prophet to the nations (*Jeremiah 1:5*). For 40 long years Jeremiah had spoken to God's people, but no one paid attention. He was opposed, persecuted and imprisoned. With no sign of a successful ministry, God then directs him to speak to the nations (*Jeremiah 46:1-2, 47:1, 48:1, 49:1, 7, 23, 28, 34*). Jeremiah's point is clear - God is over all nations. There is a clear message for us too!

1. **He is ruler:** - He is intimately involved in global affairs as well as the details of my life.
2. **He is just:** - He must judge wrongdoing where it is found.
3. **He is merciful:** - His grace comes to all nations and people who repent.
