8. How do you think verse 58 should encourage and motivate us to serve and obey God?

WORK IT OUT:

9. If Christ returns in your lifetime, how should your attitude or actions change today?
10. How can your Growth Group help or come alongside you in this endeavor?

We live best in the present when we have a good view of the future...and we have a fantastic future! As the famous Resurrection Chapter (1 Corinthians 15) comes to a close, it reveals three great victories in Jesus. These final verses (1 Corinthians 15:50-58) are a kind of symphony of praise and celebration. In the midst of our daily struggles and challenges, let's take a broader look into the future and celebrate Jesus as Victor. When he is victorious, we are victorious.

1. **A Transformed Body** - (1 Corinthians 15:50-53). Victory in Jesus means a fresh new body for all eternity!
2. **The End to Sin and Death** - (1 Corinthians 15:54-57). Victory in Jesus means that sin and all its ugly fingerprints will be wiped clean.
3. **Compensation for Faithful Toiling** - (1 Corinthians 15:58). Victory in Jesus brings rewards.
