1. What was the most defiant thing you once did against your parents' wishes - something which you can laugh about now but perhaps wasn't so funny at the time?
2. What got your attention or surprised you in Sunday's sermon?

TALK IT OUT:

3. How does our culture typically respond to sinful, wrong or hateful acts?
4. How should we deal with people who have committed a wrong against us?
5. What sets us apart as God's people from how our culture typically responds?
6. How do the actions and prayers of Moses challenge us in our relationships? At work? At home?

WORK IT OUT:

7. Who is there in your life that cannot intervene for themselves? (As you have received God's grace - pray for them.) Who has blatantly hurt you or abandoned you? (As God intervened for you, would you intervene for them?)
8. How can your growth group pray for you this week?

UNDESERVING INTERVENTION

If ever there was a group of people deserving complete annihilation, it was the people of God. What they did was unacceptable, and everyone knew it. But then, in came one of the most audacious prayers in the Bible. Moses intervened on behalf of the people of God, ultimately saving the lives of millions. So now, let's talk about you. Who is most undeserving of your prayerful intervention? For that person we will intervene today.

1. **The setting of today's intervention** - (*Exodus 32:1-6*). The story leaves us all wanting to destroy these ungrateful people.
2. **The awkward conversation** - (*Exodus 32:11-13*). What sets a Christian apart from others is our love for the unlovable.
3. **The staggering result** - (*Exodus 32:14*). Um, so... God changed his mind?
