BREAK IT OUT:

1. Most of us are old enough to recognize when the “old becomes new again”. Do you long for something to return that has been gone for far too long? Share one or two examples.
2. What got your attention, made you think or was a new idea on Sunday?

TALK IT OUT:

3. What contrasts do you see between the Old Testament law and the Gospel?
4. Paul says Moses ministry which leads to condemnation and death was glorious. Do you agree? Why or why not?
5. What purpose does God’s law in the Old Testament have today?
6. Paul speaks of the Gospel which leads to righteousness and life as glorious. What does that mean?
7. On a scale of 1-10 (10 being highest), how would you rate your boldness in sharing the hope you find in the Gospel? Why do you give yourself that rating?
8. How can we help those who would turn back from such a great salvation and seek to be right with God by some form of human effort? Is this a struggle for you?

WORK IT OUT:

9. What step will you take this week to be bold in your witness to a lost world knowing that what you proclaim is better by far and will bring glory to God?
10. In light of Sunday’s sermon, what are some ways your growth group can pray for you?
